

A. INTRODUCTION

WUN Hub is a database that enables WUN researchers to find and connect with WUN colleagues and WUN-supported research projects.

WUN researchers join the HUB by creating a profile that illustrates their affiliation, research interests, and participation in WUN research projects as Principal Investigator and/or Co-Investigator. This profile enables WUN colleagues with related interests to identify and connect with each other. Registered users can search the HUB to find information on members with particular research interests and active WUN research projects. It is also possible to post and view calls for collaborators to join a potential research project, and view calls for funding opportunities.

This guide provides information on how to use the platform.

B. HOW TO CREATE A RESEARCHER PROFILE

- Please create your WUN Hub researcher profile via the **sign up** button on the [WUN Hub page](#).
- The more detailed your profile, the easier it will be to connect with other WUN researchers. Additional entries can be added by using the **+** icon.
- Please add the WUN Research group(s) that you are involved in as Principal Investigator and/or Co-Investigator (if any).
- Researcher profiles can be edited any time.

C. LOGIN TO THE SYSTEM

The system will send a confirmation email once you have submitted your WUN Hub Researcher profile via the sign up form. Please check your spam folder if you did not receive the confirmation email.

You can now login to the WUN portal [via this link](#). You may wish to bookmark it on your computer for easy access.

Forgot your password? You can reset it by clicking “Forgot?” on the login page and entering your email address. Please check your spam folder if you did not receive a link to change your password.

J. CALL FOR COLLABORATORS FEATURE

As a researcher, you may be seeking new research opportunities that require new collaborations.

You can post a call for collaborators in WUN Hub for the benefit of building culturally, geographically and disciplinary diverse research teams, and accessing the value that membership to WUN provides.

The call for collaborators feature will be particularly useful during preparation for the [WUN RDF](#) application process. In publishing a call for collaborators in WUN Hub, you will have a much broader reach of potential RDF team members from across the network.

We recommend working with your local [WUN Coordinator](#) who manages the WUN Research Development Fund application process for your university and can offer support. **Note: please ask them to approve your call as it will remain 'pending review' until approved by your Coordinator. They also have to send the email notification manually (left top corner).**


Desired Collaborator Profile *

Go to “Submit a Call for Collaborators” and fill out the form. Your call will be pending until the WUN Coordinator at your university approves the call. They will receive an alert to review each time you post a call.

We recommend using a brief proposal summary which could be the same as your WUN RDF application (if you were submitting an RDF proposal), or your proposal to other funding bodies.

SEND EMAIL NOTIFICATIONS AFTER PUBLISHING A CALL

Whenever a researcher submits a call, it will stay in draft (pending review) until their local WUN Coordinator approves the call. Please ask them to approve your call as soon as possible. For an email notification to go out to the WUN Hub Community --the researchers who have indicated they want to receive these emails-- an extra step is needed: press the 'send email notification' button in the left upper corner. If you don't see this button, please ask your local WUN Coordinator to do it for you. This step is crucial for your call to reach the WUN research community.

Proposal Summary	The nature of tensions around sustainability objectives is profound, decision-makers face tensions and contradictions when dealing with opposing stakeholder interests or competition over scarce resources.
